I CALL TO ORDER

Supervisor Seneck called the regular meeting to order at 7:01 p.m.

II PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Councilmember Tom Ives led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

III APPROVAL OF MINUTES

RESOLUTION - Motion to dispense with the reading of the minutes from the November 09, 2022, meeting was moved by Councilmember Tom Ives. Seconded by Councilmember Terry Ives. Ayes: Councilmember Terry Ives, Tom Ives, Matt Retz, and Gilda Ward. Noes: None. Motion carries.

RESOLUTION - Motion to approve the minutes from the November 09, 2022, meeting as presented was moved by Councilmember Terry Ives. Seconded by Councilmember Matt Retz. Ayes: Councilmember Terry Ives, Tom Ives, Matt Retz, and Gilda Ward. Noes: None. Motion carries.

IV UPDATE GUILFORD WATER-BRENDON BECKER Water testing of the Youngs well indicates sulfur which can easily be chlorinated. Three additional test wells were drilled, one on the tank property and two on Fleming properties. The test well closest to the Dexheimer property will be abandoned for poor results. The pump tests indicate 6 and 7 gallons per minute from the two wells nearest the tank. These wells, being so close to the current tank, would easily tie into our system and would support the daily demand.

Plans moving forward would be the design for connecting the Youngs well to the system and sending this off to DOH for approval and get it out to bid. In addition, designing a well control building near the current tank and connecting the two new wells into the system as primary would be completed. The Youngs site will tie in and be a secondary location as a backup and a second test well is suggested to be drilled in the spring. DOH will make us install meters. Meter pits are suggested.

V JUSTICE POSITION DISCUSSION Would like to propose changing from a two judge to a single judge court system. It would be the recommendation to have one Judge and a Court Clerk. Supervisor Seneck will investigate legal obligations and election timelines.

VI FROM THE FLOOR – Speaker 1 Borden Hose has provided a copy of the 2021 Federal 990 report. Borden Hose acknowledged receipt of the ARPA funds distribution from the Town and appreciates the financial assistance.

VII REPORTS

A. SUPERVISOR – Supervisor Seneck reported the following:

- 1. The SSL Certificate for the town's website is now provided at no charge by our web host.
- 2. Purchased 50 queries for the FMCSA. (Federal Motor Carrier Safety Admin.)
- 3. The quarterly BAGS meeting was held Wednesday, Dec. 7th no change in our yearly contribution.
- 4. Want to thank town board members for touring the Blue Stone Wind Farm last Friday.
- 5. Emailed board members a letter from the county Farmland Protection Board suggesting the town consider developing land use regulations.
- 6. Met with Bergman Engineering to review required engineering work for the Guilford Lake Dam. Supervisor Seneck reviewed items discussed at the meeting.
- 7. Request to Audit Justice Books was received and will be scheduled next month.
- 8. Mentor Program offered by Commerce Chenango.

B. TOWN CLERK – Town Clerk Jodie Ives reported the following:

- 1. The November Statistics report was included in the board packet. There was nothing out of the ordinary on that.
- 2. The November Dog Control Officer report was included in the board packet. There were three dog seizures in November to SPCA; however, no license and redemption fees were paid to the town.
- 3. A copy of the approved 2023 budget was included in the board packet.
- 4. Gail worked with Brendon Becker to calculate the reimbursement from EFC for the Guilford Water Project. This includes expenses for both 2021 and 2022 for almost \$98,000.
- 5. We are preparing for the upcoming tax season. Tax bills are tentatively scheduled to be ready at the County, Thursday, December 15, 2022.
- 6. Holiday Office Closures will be Saturday, December 24 through Monday, December 26, 2022, and Monday, January 2, 2023.

C. FINANCIALS – Supervisor Seneck reported the following:

- 1. Page 1 and 2 totals do not agree. Money still due for Guilford Water Capital Checking.
- 2. Page 5 received \$172,000 more Sales Tax and \$31,000 Mortgage Tax revenue than budgeted.
- 3. Page 5 Fines and Forfeitures are more than budgeted.
- 4. Page 7 Highway Appropriations: Repairs Personnel up 12%, Fuel Up 23%, and Snow Personnel up 8% from 2021.
