Pursuant to Section 36 of the Town Law of the State of New York, the Town of Guilford hereby does abolish the office of Town Tax Collector; the abolition of said office to take effect at the expiration of the term of office to which the present incumbent was elected.

Upon the expiration of the term of the office of the present Tax Collector, said Collector shall surrender and deliver to the Town Clerk of the Town of Guilford all assessment rolls, books, papers, writings and all other documents and property in his possession as such officer. It shall thence and forthwith be the duty of the Town Clerk to collect and receive all state, county and town taxes and assessments that may be levied in the Town of Guilford, and the Town Clerk shall have all the powers and be subject to all the duties of a Collector with respect to the collection of such taxes, the deposit of receipts and the return of unpaid taxes, as provided by Subdivision 1 of Section 35 of the Town Law of the State of New York.
