LOCAL LAW NO. 2 OF THE YEAR 2018

A LOCAL LAW ENTITLED “RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS”

Be it enacted by the Town Board of the Town of Guilford as follows:

Section 1. Legislative Intent. The Town Board of the Town of Guilford recognizes that it is desirable to hire employees who are residents of the Town. The Town Board further recognizes that the most qualified candidates may not always be residents of the Town of Guilford. Therefore, it is in the best interests of the Town of Guilford that nonresidents be permitted to work as employees of the Town of Guilford in specific appointed positions.

Section 2. Authority. The authority for the Town Board of Guilford to appoint nonresidents as employees lies in § 10, Subdivision 1(d)(3), of the Municipal Home Rule Law.

Section 3. Constable. The position of Town Constable may be filled by a resident of the Town of Guilford, or a resident of the County of Chenango and adjoining counties.

Section 4. Remainder. Except as hereinabove amended, the remainder of the Code of the Town of Guilford shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 5. Separability. The provisions of this Local Law are separable and if any provision, clause, sentence, subsection, word or part thereof is held illegal, invalid, unconstitutional, or inapplicable to any person or circumstance, such illegality, invalidity or unconstitutionality, or inapplicability shall not affect or impair any of the remaining provisions, clauses, sentences, subsections, words, or parts of this local law or their application to other persons or circumstances. It is hereby declared to be the legislative intent that this local law would have been adopted if such illegal, invalid, or unconstitutional provision, clause, sentence, subsection, word or part had not been included therein, and as if such person or circumstance, to which the local law or part thereof is held inapplicable, had been specifically exempt therefrom.

Section 6. Effective Date. This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the New York State Secretary of State in accordance with Section 27 of the Municipal Home Rule Law.
